COVID-19 Updates/Community Resources



- VaxTeen communicates directly with teenagers and young adults to counter this dangerous tide of misinformation, encouraging those who are unvaccinated to catch up on vaccines as soon as they can by helping them find out what immunizations they need and how they can get them.
- New! MMWR: Infection in School Employees After Vaccination Program
 - Weekly SARS-CoV-2 antigen screening tests required of all employees returning for in-school instruction in the School District of Philadelphia found a 95% lower percentage of positive test results among persons who reported receipt of 2 doses of COVID-19 mRNA vaccine (0.09%) than among those who were unvaccinated (1.77%). Efforts to promote COVID-19 vaccination among school staff members before the upcoming 2021–22 school year will be foundational to ensure a safe learning environment.

It is our hope to have all the *Back to School* paperwork available on the first day of school. Please do your part in getting them turned in! It is

imperative, especially when dealing with allergies and other health issues, that we be informed.

Parents are required to submit updated immunization records prior to the start of school. Kindergarten students will not be allowed in the classroom if you have not submitted records.

Mrs. Ballard will be given a list of students not in compliance.


Parents of students entering seventh grade: Your child must have proof of the Tdap booster given after the child's 7th birthday. Mrs. Cota will contact you if she does not have the paperwork.



Although not required, parents of students 12 and older *may* submit proof of their child's Covid-19 vaccine. If a student is exposed to another student who has tested positive, this information will help guide us through the decision tree more efficiently.



<u>DAILY</u>: Please provide your child(ren) with a snack for breaktime, a refillable water bottle, and a lunch with the utensils necessary (spoon/fork).
